Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls

1. From 12 o'clock noon on 1st November until midnight on 2nd November, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion and prayed for the Pope's intentions (one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice) can gain one Plenary Indulgence by visiting a church or oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostles' Creed.



This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed. Confession may be made at any time within the week preceding or the week following 1st November. **During this time of Covid an Act of Contrition will suffice. Holy Communion may be received on any day from 1st November to 8th November.**

2. The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a Plenary Indulgence applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1st to 8th November. The conditions mentioned above apply also for this.

Purgatorial Offerings: There are special envelopes for the Purgatorial Offerings available in both Churches and also from the Parish Office, for those **not using the weekly envelopes.** Masses for the deceased are celebrated on the First Fridays and other times throughout the year.

Friday next 5th November is the First Friday: Arrangements can be made with a family member who normally lives with or visits a housebound person to bring Holy Communion to them.

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR TROCAIRE 6th/7th NOVEMBER

In the countries where Trócaire works, less than 5% of the population have been vaccinated for Covid and infection rates are up to 50%. An additional 200 million people have fallen into poverty globally as a result of the Covid crisis. Bishops highlight that wealthier countries, while protecting their most vulnerable citizens, also have a moral responsibility to ensure that the populations of developing countries have equal, rapid and effective access to Covid vaccine coverage. Bishops are asking parishes throughout Ireland to undertake a special Church collection on 6th and 7th November to invite the public to support Trócaire in its work to alleviate this humanitarian crisis in East Africa.
